- 4) O as \underline{o} in d \underline{o} g or fr \underline{o} g
- 5) U as $\underline{\mathbf{u}}$ in $\underline{\mathbf{r}}$ ude or d $\underline{\mathbf{u}}$ de
- 6) W as in <u>eew</u>

Tsiaj Ntawv Niam Txooj Muaj 7 Tug

There are 7 Complex Vowels

I) UA as in CUA (wind wind)

7) OO as in ZOO (good)

Tone Description

- I) b high tone
- 2) m low tone
- 3) d fall rising tone
- 4) j falling tone
- 5) v rising tone
- 6) ua mid tone
- 7) s mid falling tone
- 8) g low falling tone

Notes

- 1) A word with different tone marker changes the meaning of that word.
- 2) Each vowel can have up to eight different tones
- 3) The vowel "ia" is only used in White Hmong writing.
